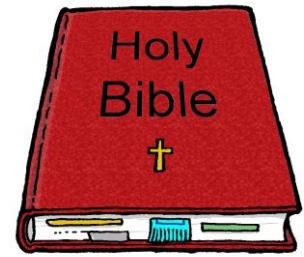

Dear Brothers and Sisters

I wonder if you have a favourite story from the Bible? One you remember from Sunday School, or have heard in church, or have read for yourself?

I have one Bible story that I particularly enjoy reading and which I find very moving. It is the story of the woman who touches Jesus' cloak and is immediately healed found in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. We don't know her name as we do with some other people that Jesus healed, we only know that she touched a piece of his clothing. She doesn't dare ask for Jesus' help, she only believes and trusts that if she touches him, she will be healed, and of course, she is healed. In fact, we're told she doesn't dare to touch him directly, she only wants to touch the hem of his cloak. This is to me such a beautiful image of trust, hope and humility, attitudes that we should all share as we look to Jesus and to what Jesus offers to us.

You may have your own favourite parable or miracle or Psalm. Words that seem to speak to you and your experience directly. Words that reflect how you are feeling at that moment or words that challenge you.

The Bible is a rich source of reflection, prayer and thought. I hope you all have a Bible somewhere at home. Please don't just let it gather dust. Open it now and again. Let God speak to you through it. Or even try our regular Bible study to find out what others are thinking and how they understand the Bible, their faith and the world around us.

Treasurer's Letter



Thank you for all your financial giving to date

Due to the Summer holidays, there isn't much news at this point except to advise that we are still falling **way short** on paying our Parish share commitment ☹. Attendance at Church services over the summer was fairly low and the weekly collections were insufficient to contribute towards payment of our Parish share. Therefore, to date we have still only paid £10,000 towards our share of £35,000 (28.6%). We should have paid just over £23,000 by the end of August (66.6%).



HOW YOU CAN HELP US TO RAISE FUNDS?

Please bring your used inkjet printer cartridges and place them in the collection box on the back table in Church. I can then send these off for recycling and raise income. The cartridges must not have been refilled before and carry only the original equipment manufacturers branding.

I recently sent away a box of cartridges for recycling; a new collection box is now in place.



Cheques have been sent to Dr Kershaw's Hospice, Spoons Neonatal Family Support and Cruse Bereavement Care for half of the monies donated by friends and families during recent baptisms. The remainder was donated to St Thomas Church. All donations are very gratefully received by Church and the various charities who send us letters of appreciation.

The children took great pride in designing the ordination cards for Fr Richard. I can assure you there was a great deal of effort put into each and every one.

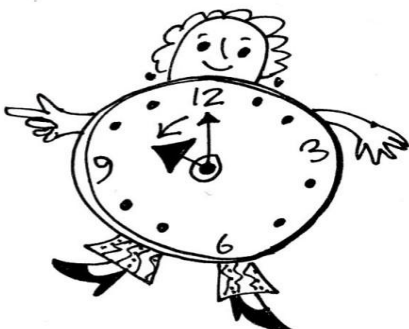

GOOD NEWS

Congratulations to Oldham Mountain Rescue Team upon receiving The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. This is the most distinguished accolade a voluntary group can receive in the UK.

A FREE bus travel pass for 16 to 18 year-olds is now up and running across Greater Manchester. For a one-off £10 administration fee, young people can get free bus travel across Greater Manchester by receiving a purple Our Pass card. Our Pass card holders also benefit from half-price off peak one-day and weekend travel cards on Metrolink. The pass is part of a 2 year pilot scheme to get more people using bus transport. Oldham's libraries service is celebrating hitting the one million visitors milestone between 2018 and 2019. It is the second most visited library network in Greater Manchester; second only to Manchester City Council Libraries. Each of Oldham's 12 libraries boasts a wide array of health, learning and business resources, family and cultural activities, and sign-posting to partner services that aim to benefit the whole town. They also offer residents a range of services and activities, including reading groups, author events, sensory story times, craft workshops, digital activities, cultural events through the live@thelibrary programme.

All are welcome to join us for the Harvest Service. Donations of tinned packet foods will be shared between Oldham Foodbank and The Booth Centre which supports the homeless in Manchester. Also donations of knitted hats, scarves and gloves will be passed on to the Booth Centre.

Toilet Twinning

I would like to give a great big Thank you to the STYLE ladies who joined me on a Pub Crawl from Moorside to Tesco. We had a great evening becoming slightly inebriated and joining in with Karaoke but most importantly we raised £150 towards twinning our Toilets.

The following day a Bake sale was held in the Church hall and funds are now in excess of £180. This is equal to 3 toilets but we have 7 toilets in church, so my goal is to raise £420 by 19th November, International Toilet Day. Each toilet twinning costs £60 but this doesn't just go to build the toilet; it also helps support education in sanitation and hygiene. The story below is about Sita and will give you just one example of how these funds could help a community.

Sita sits under the huge mango tree beside her home in Ivory Coast, enjoying the sweet scent. Not long ago, the stench was overpowering: there were no toilets in the village. Sita's children were constantly sick with diarrhoea and the family made regular visits to the medical centre for vital medicines they couldn't afford. Sometimes, the nurse would give them a week's grace to pay. But Sita and her husband are casual labourers on the local cashew plantation and work is poorly paid and scarce.

Occasionally, they would borrow from neighbours to pay the nurse. But it was rare that others had money to spare. So the debts mounted up. 'We felt hopeless, trapped,' Sita says. 'We didn't want to live anymore.' Since Toilet Twinning's partner MAP started teaching people about hygiene and sanitation, families like Sita's have built a latrine behind their home. There's a new community water pump by the school too and a village water management committee to ensure it's properly maintained.

Now, Sita's family are healthy and no longer have to spend money on medicines. They can afford to send the children to school and have started to build a new home. 'Now, thank God, our village is clean, my family is much healthier and there's no more debt.' Toilet Twinning's supporters dug deep so that change became possible. Sita and her family have been blessed – and they know it. Their health, hope and dignity have all been restored.

If you visit one of the toilets in church or the church hall please consider spending a penny or two, and placing some coins in the box placed there to support toilet twinning. Every little helps.

Church Wardens Letter



Things are never quiet here at St. Thomas'. September saw something extremely special in our Church with Richard's ordination. This is something which would normally happen in a Cathedral. It was spectacular to see our Church so full of people all supporting Richard, Hannah, also their friends and families. I have asked Richard about the correct term of reference for him post ordination and the following are taken from his useful reply.

"In an ideal world calling a priest father would seem correct.", "In the magazine put it down as Fr Richard (surname a little too formal)", "I do prefer Fr to Reverend but mainly because I dislike alliteration. In practice I'm quite happy to be simply called Richard". So, with that we are delighted to welcome Fr Richard to our Church family.

On the renovations front things are now moving at pace and we are hopeful that the works will be finished on schedule. The old cross which used to be on the spire and acted as the lightning conductor was badly corroded and has been replaced with a shiny new cross as pictured above. We will find a place in Church to display the old one.

The works are meaning that the housekeeping and cleaning of the Church is feeling a little like painting the Forth Bridge, so if you can offer help in cleaning then it would be massively appreciated. At the current time we have a rota, although the number of people offering help means that people's names appear more frequently than we would like. We are still looking at other options which may include changing to a cleaning day on a monthly basis with top-up cleans for large events like weddings, baptisms, etc.

We started our confirmation classes on Wednesday September 11th; these will run through to the Confirmation service on **November 17th**. Heritage Day and Gift Weekend were on the 14th and 15th September which was a great chance to showcase our Church to a wider audience. We also had both crosses on display in Church.



Looking forward, our Harvest Service is on the **13th October** which is also parade service so that the uniformed groups can share in this with us all. We are asking for donations of packets/tinned food, also knitted hats, scarves and gloves. Any donations received will go to Oldham Foodbank and the Booth Centre in Manchester.

Following the success of last year's visit November 8th will also see a parish visit to Mirfield. There will be more details nearer the date.

Sunday school has been planning and are starting to rehearse their Nativity. If you do not worship on Sunday at the 10.30am service but have a child who may be interested in taking part then please contact one of the leaders.

We are always pleased to see new faces in our Church, so if you are new to us then we hope that you have been made to feel welcome. We understand that it may feel daunting coming into the building and not knowing anybody and have been looking at making ourselves also sidespersons on duty easier to identify and will soon have some badges indicating that we are "Happy to help".

The PCC recently agreed to sign up to Inclusive Church. This means that once accepted we agree to continue demonstrating our welcoming spirit to all; more about this can be found at www.inclusive-church.org. Whilst we are all learning about new things, Sam has taken her new wardens training and Simon has looked into refresher training.

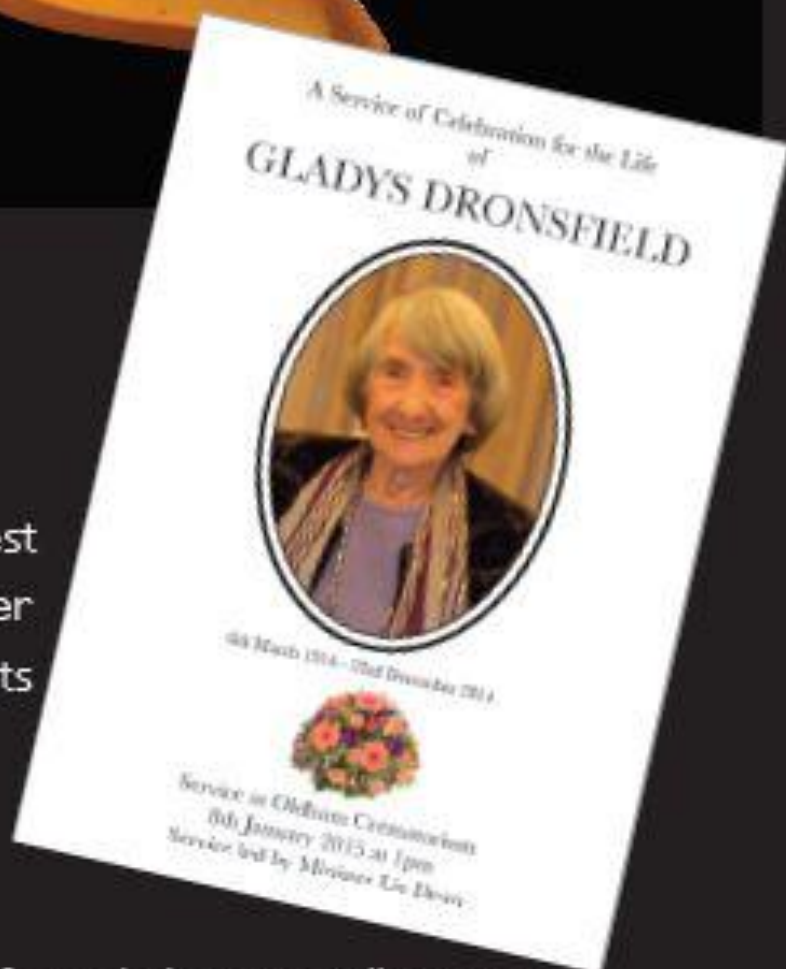

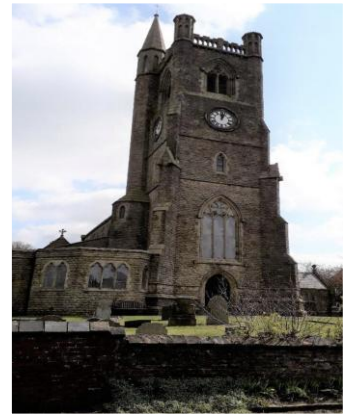
